





HOW TO CREATE A VIRTUAL CLASSROOM

How to Create a Classroom


- Log in to your Shmoop account and visit your Shmoop Dashboard by clicking your name on the upper right corner of the screen (or top of the display on mobile).
- Find the "Create Classroom" button. (Your students will see "Join Classroom.")



Name your virtual classroom (e.g., Awesome ACT Prep, Ms. Everdeen's Lit Course, or AP Biology-5th Period).



- Choose the school/license associated with your account.
- Click the Test Prep products or Courses that you would like to use. (Additional products can be added later; maximum of 4 products per classroom.)



6. Click "Create Classroom."



How to Invite Students

 Students can join your classroom within their dashboard by using your class code and teacher email.

 Use the "Upload Students" button to add students to your class roster.



How to Use Virtual Classroom

- The classroom overview page allows you to create announcements, see the classroom code, and link to the classroom products.
- The manage tab is where you will edit your classroom settings.
- The gradebook is where all student activity is tracked and assignments are graded. You can click "overview" to summarize students' activity, filter by student name or product, and download results in a .csv file.
- The email button allows you to send emails to all students or specific students.

- 1. Contact your account manager or support@shmoop.com. We keep this data protected, so it's a privilege that needs to be granted by Shmoop.
- 2. Once you've been granted access, you will sign in to your Shmoop account and visit your Shmoop Dashboard (https://schools.shmoop.com/my/shmoop/).
- **3.** The analytics button will appear in your Shmoop Dashboard under the "Licenses" heading.

What Analytics Can Do for You?

- View user activity. Is one of your students logging on every day for three hours while another is checking in just long enough to earn his "Minimum Effort" badge for Shmoop Scouts? Shmoop Analytics will open a magical portal so you can see all your students' comings and goings.
- Invite teachers and principals. Use the analytics "Teacher" tool
 to invite Teachers to register their Shmoop accounts. The
 "Principals" page will invite principals to view and track their
 individual school's analytics.
- Identify top schools, classrooms, and students using Shmoop.
 Feel like you're alone in the Shmoop universe? Don't be. Here you can see who else is in the same boat. You can also keep an eye on them to make sure no one is hoarding the life vests.






